**AAI Employees extend their helping hand to the natural calamity victims of Uttarakhand by contributing One-day salary (Approx. 3.20 crores), setting up Relief Camp-cum-Help Desk and round-the-clock operations at Jolly Grant Airport, Dehradun**

In an initiative to express solidarity with the flood-ravaged State, Airports Authority of India extends round-the-clock operations facility at Jolly Grant Airport in an excellent coordination between AAI, State Government of Uttarakhand and the Indian Air Force to enable seamless flow of Choppers, Aircraft and Ground Operations for the relief operations in the natural calamity hit State.

AAI mobilized all of its infrastructure to extend the help for efficient and smooth operations at this small airport having limited resources. In a bid to enhance the search and rescue operations from the Jolly Grant Airport, Dehradun; Aircraft movements ranging from 53 on 18th June, 2013 to 120+ as on date were handled successfully through optimum utilization by AAI officials working round the clock.

In addition to various Camps set up around the airport including that of State Government, AAI has also set up a Help Desk-cum-Relief Camp to extend emergency services for the flood victims and provide possible help and cooperation to the passengers, their relatives and well-wishers at the

airports. AAI has waived off the landing parking charges for relief flights operation through this airport.

The flights of the VIPs who visited the flood affected area include Hon'ble Prime Minister, Chairperson, UPA, Vice-President, UPA, Chief Minister of Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh, Haryana, Home Minister, Govt. of Maharashtra, Secretary (Home) and Secretary (Defence), Govt. of India. The calamity took place on 17th June and AAI team came into action extending all assistance and started Help Desk-cum-Relief Camp on 18th June, 2013 itself.

The Airport Operations at Chennai Airport is going to be normal as laid down "Contingency Plan" is being implemented in the wake of Mass Casual Leave call of the Recognized Union as a protest for Privatization of Chennai & Kolkata Airport.

Airports Authority of India at Chennai Airport is taking number of steps to engage additional manpower from the City Fire Brigade to man the fire station of Chennai Airport including additional ambulances from the city hospitals as standby arrangements. Similarly steps are being taken to sensitize the local police and CISF to man the vital installation of Airport.

To monitor the situation, arising out of the Mass Casual Leave call from the Union, a Central Control Room is being established at Chennai Airport.

The Terminal Management including the cleanliness and upkeepment of the public convenience facilities shall be taken care by out sourced contract labour at both Domestic as well as International Terminal at Chennai Airport.

Similarly the electrical and electronics gadgets are being taken care by the additional man power of the contractors to ensure full serviceability of the facilities to the entire satisfaction of Airport users.

To ensure that all the services at Airport are available, action is being taken to call back the officers from leave and also from the training institution to man the services during the period.
